DESCRIPTION: Bill Plewes | Town of Collingwood, Director of Building Services and Chief Building Official - A look into the changes that have been made in Part 7 of the OBC. BIOGRAPHY: Mr. Bill Plewes, CBO

Bill is employed with the Town of Collingwood as the Director of Building Services and the Chief Building Official. Bill has been with the Town for 24 years. Prior to starting with the Town, Bill was working as a licensed Plumber on multi-residential buildings. During the 24 years in the Building Department, Bill has achieved his designations for

In 1997, Bill designed and produced the Intermediate Plumbing Course for the Ministry of Housing. This course was presented numerous times throughout Ontario until the 2006 version came out.

Bill Chaired the AMTS Committee for the conferences held at Blue Mountain Resorts in 2003 and again in 2010. He also has been very active in facilitating courses for the Local College in Barrie and the OBOA for more than 16 years.
